

MEMBERS SURVEY KEY FINDINGS 2019





















membership survey is carried out every 3 years in order to offer an insight into the people involved with and economic impact of the development trust movement in Scotland.



Membership

As at October 2019, DTAS has 285 members, 214 of these are full members and 69 are provisional members. Provisional membership is offered to younger organisations who are in the early stages of operating to the development trust model, and the majority of these organisations will not yet own assets and will be grant dependent at this stage.

The membership survey was completed in August 2019 and contains data from 270 DTAS members. A total of 53,114 people are currently members of their local development trust with the average membership per development trust being 196 people.

Board members

2,348 people are currently serving on the boards of development trusts, with an average of 8 directors per board.

Staff

There is a total of 1,395 people employed by DTAS members.




This figure is made up of 588 full-time and 807 part-time positions.

Volunteers

Discounting board members, DTAS members reported a total of 9.422 volunteers, with an average of 35 volunteers per development trust. The estimated total number of volunteer hours given in a year is 33,512 hours - at the Living Wage, this equates to a contribution worth a staggering £7,501,608.

If we add in average board member hours, again calculated at the minimum wage, volunteer contribution exceeded £8 million.

Assets



45 DTAS members have assets that are worth over £1 million.

Annual income

Aggregated reported turnover was £57.9 million of which, self-generated or trading income accounted for £30,7million.



This represents 53% of turnover an increase of over 10% from 2016's survey.
