

Facilities Management

Funded by William Grant Foundation, Development Trusts Association Scotland (DTAS) has delivered a two-year facilities management pilot programme ending March 2024 (now extended 2026).

1 – 1 Support

75 groups have been supported directly by the DTAS Facilities Management advisor Predominately community centres, hubs, and village halls providing a mix of facilities and services. Other assets types have included shops, short-term holiday lets, piers and marinas, renewable energy installations, woodland, and housing.

Training

90 groups completed 2-day training

An external facilities management expert covering regulatory requirements, operational management, fostering strategic facilities management.




