





- Seaweed eventually identified as a project in 2016!








Why Seaweed Farming?

Aim: To create a financially viable, environmentally sustainable and socially beneficial seaweed business.

- People and place sustainable community local benefits
- Environmental benefits Absorbs Carbon Dioxide and Nitrogen, leaves wild stocks alone
- Site at Bendoran access to the sea, space for necessary infrastructure
- Market opportunities biorefinery, bioplastics, aquaculture, food







How it worked (or should have)...

- 6ha Farm 3 x 2ha rectangles
- 6km seeded line (Saccharina Latissima)
- Deployed over 2 weeks 1 day per week
- 6 people, local fishing boat and a rib
- 1 section of site leased to another individual in return for skills and help.
- Fortnightly checks and assessment
- Harvest in April/May

- Community owned business
