Prosperity



- £23m investment in 1961
- Equates to half a billion pounds today
- ‘Glasgow overspill’ – plant opens 1963
- 1967 - Scotland’s first ever Shopping Centre
- Fell into decline after closure of car plant in 1981 - 13,000 unemployed – “Linwood no more”
- Decline of shopping centre/Balmore Properties (Guise for Tesco)



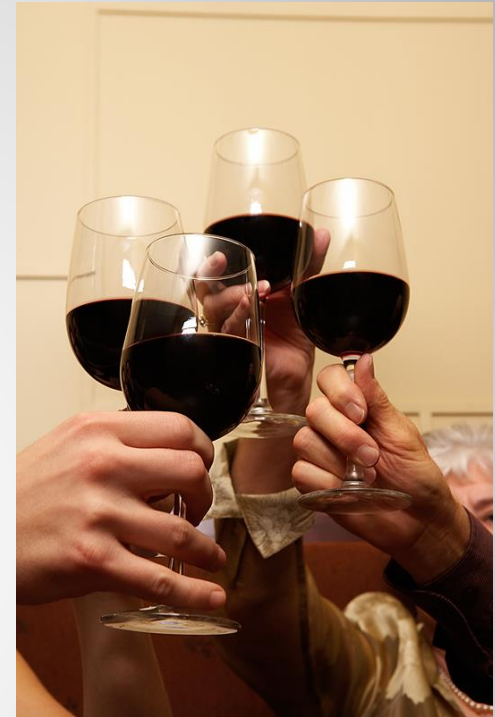
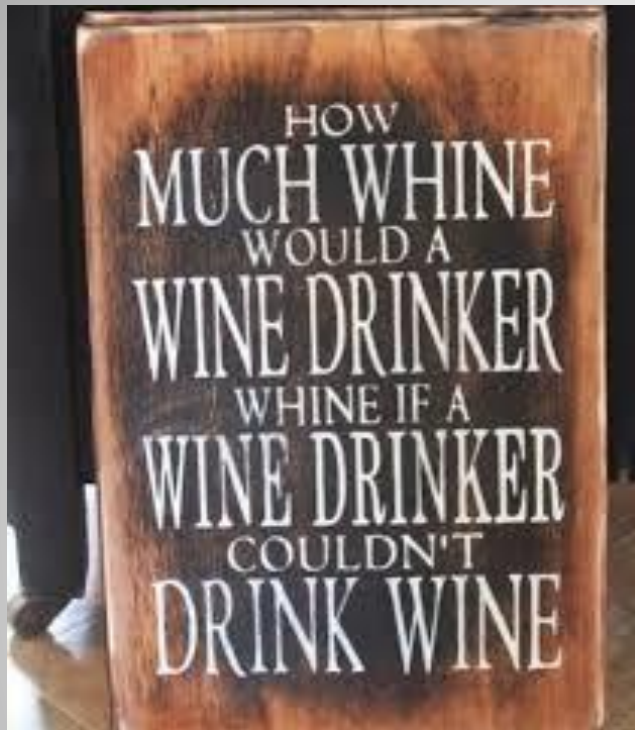


Tesco Timeline

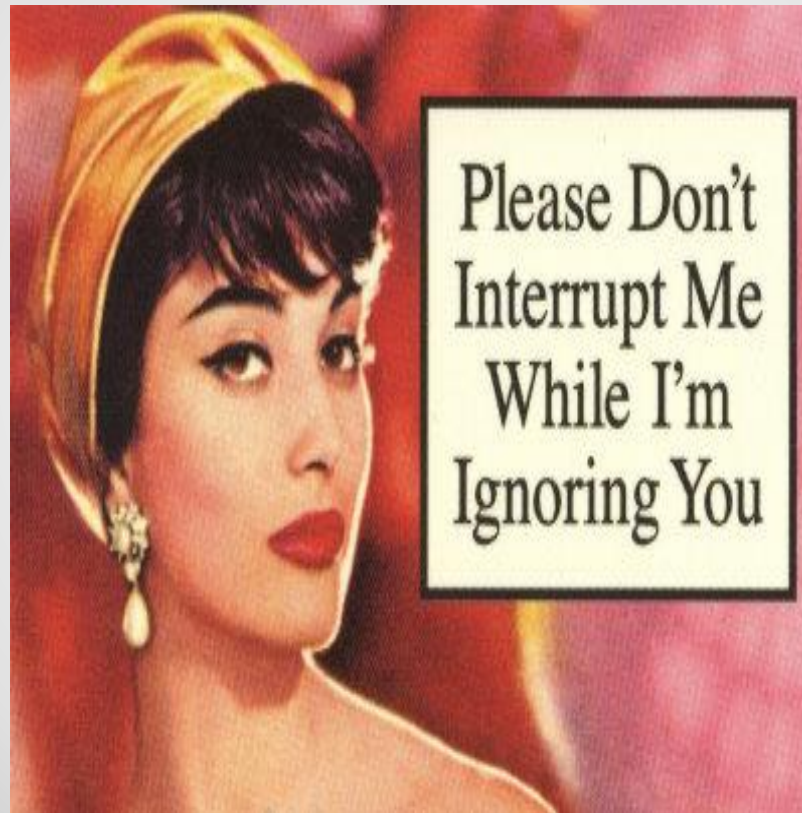

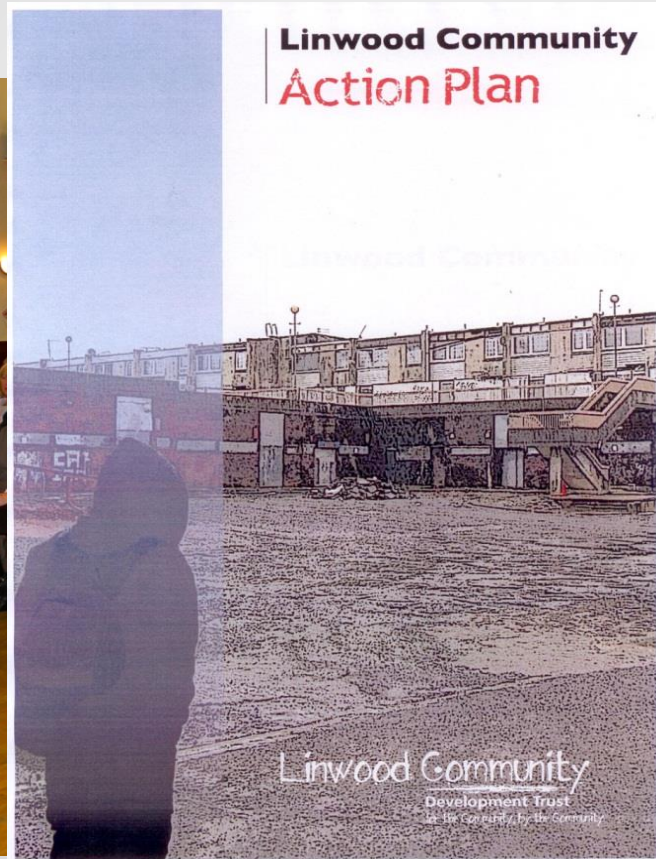
